Shirley Manson is the charismatic voice and the visual as well as conceptual core of Garbage. Since the 1990s, she has shaped the band with her unmistakable presence and uncompromising stance. As a singer, songwriter and cultural icon, she stands for self-determination, resilience and a clear feminist perspective within pop and rock music.

On "Let All That We Imagine Be The Light", Manson reveals herself as open and reflective as never before – an artist who consciously embraces experience, age and vulnerability as creative forces. "Let All That We Imagine Be The Light" is Garbage's eighth studio album: a powerful, emotionally expansive work born out of an unexpected rupture. Following the abrupt halt of their 2024 tour and Manson's serious injury, the band found themselves in a moment of enforced stillness – and transformed it into creative space.

While Manson was recovering from surgery, **Butch Vig, Duke Erikson and Steve Marker crafted dense sonic landscapes** that became the foundation of an album that understands vulnerability not as weakness, but as strength. Thematically, the record revolves around impermanence, togetherness and hope – asking how to live a full and courageous life in uncertain times. Musically, it merges atmospheric breadth with dramatic force and cinematic depth.

"Let All That We Imagine Be The Light" is a compelling statement on humanity, resilience and the luminous power of collective imagination. On June 8, 2026, Garbage bring this new chapter to the stage at Open Air Arena Wien – an intense live experience balancing force, intimacy and shared hope. We can hardly wait.
